Dr. Jeffrey Reeves has been an Associate Professor with the Daniel K. Inouye Asia-Pacific Center for Security Studies since 2012. Before taking his position at the DKI APCSS, Dr. Reeves worked as a Research Fellow with Griffith University in Brisbane, Australia and as Director of Chinese Studies at the Center for Advanced Defense Studies, a Washington D.C.-based think tank. Between 2001 and 2007, Dr. Reeves worked with the United States Peace Corps as a



human development specialist and with the United Nations in Beijing as a Human Security analyst. During his graduate studies, Dr. Reeves worked as a university lecturer and professor focused on Asian security, economics, and politics with the London School of Economics, Columbia University, Peking University, and Central University for Finance and Economics in Beijing. Dr. Reeves worked as a political and economic consultant with the Korean Embassy in London from 2006 to 2007 and as a Research Assistant at the London School of Economics' Asia Research Centre from 2006-2008.

Dr. Reeves is the author of *Chinese Foreign Relations with Weak Peripheral States: Asymmetrical Economic Power and Insecurity* (Routledge 2015) and *Non-Traditional Security in East Asia: A Regime Approach* (Imperial College Press 2015). He has published widely on Chinese foreign policy and security studies in Asia in top-tier journals including *Asian Security, Terrorism and Political Violence, The China Quarterly, The Washington Quarterly,* and *Pacific Review*, among others.

Dr. Reeves received his PhD in International from the London School of Economics and Political Science and his Master's Degree in Chinese Studies from the University of Edinburgh.
