Dr. Virginia B. Watson participated in the first Thailand Security Dialogue held in Bangkok, Thailand on August 26-28, 2024. She served as a panel member in the session "Energy and Environmental Security: Implications for Sustainable Peace to the Region," presenting a briefing on "Climate Change, Energy, and Defense Nexus." The event was organized by the National Defence Studies Institute and featured both civilian and military speakers from Thailand as well as various international institutions. Dr. Miemie Byrd's article on "<u>Myanmar military on verge of falling from</u> <u>power, analysts say</u>" was published last month by the *Indo-Pacific Defense Forum.*
