

MARS Launch! Building Defense Industrial Base Resilience



Fellow Project Completion Spotlight

In this episode of *Fellows of Change*, DKI APCSS Professor Dr. Andrea Malji speaks with Squadron Leader Shashika Sandaruwan Ekanayake (CSC 23-2), an aircraft engineer and leader in the Sri Lanka Air Force, about his Fellow Project. Ekanayake identified a critical cyber knowledge gap among midgrade officers and turned that challenge into action. With mentorship from DKI APCSS Professor Dr. James Minnich, he developed and implemented a cyber resilience training program that is now part of the Sri Lanka Air Force's Junior Command and Staff College curriculum.
